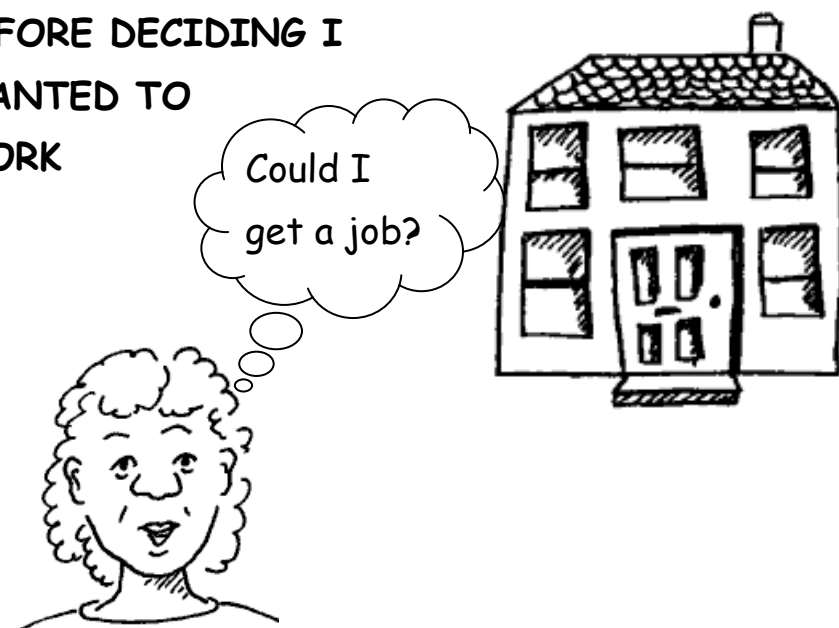


ACCESS TO WORK—A PERSONAL STORY BY AMANDA

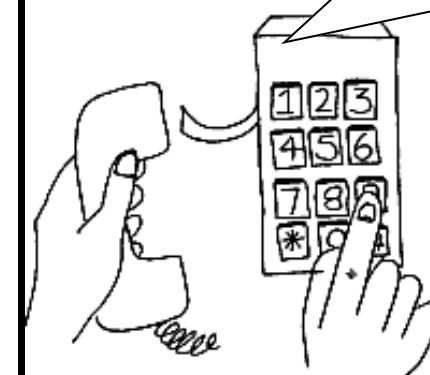

6. WHAT ACCESS TO WORK PROVIDES ME WITH:

After talking to the Access to Work person on the phone and explaining to them what I would have to do in my new job, they said they would give me money to get these things:

1. A taxi to work and back home everyday

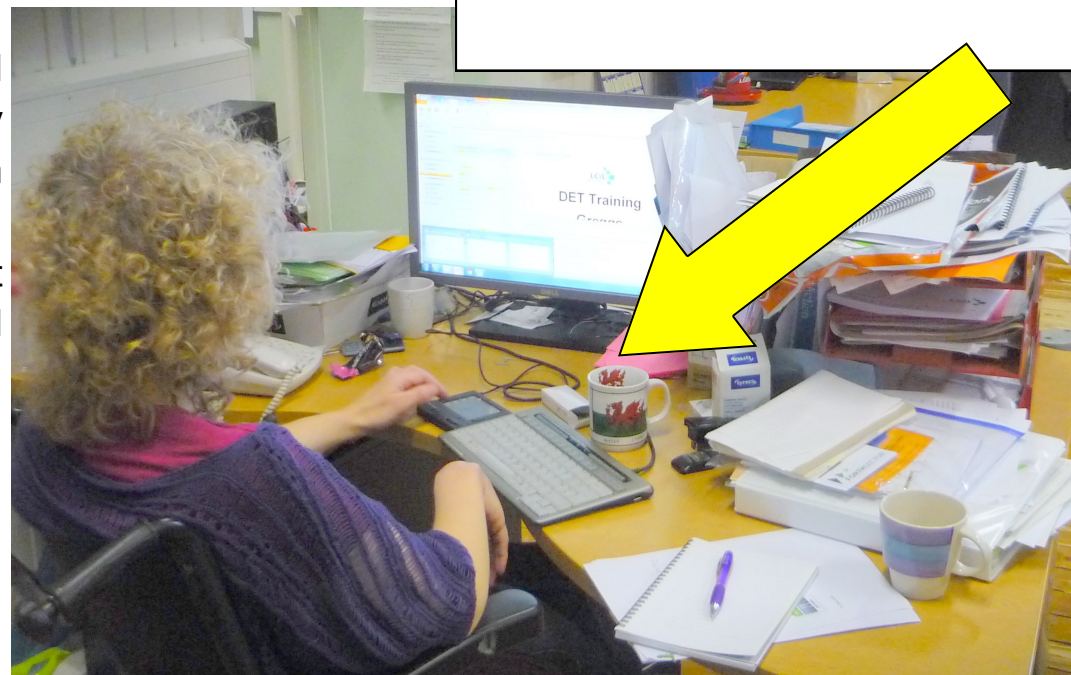

2. A support worker to help with some of the things that I need help with at work e.g. filling, photocopying

3. Travel in work—this helps me to pay for the extra cost of having to have taxis when I need to go to meetings for work

4. Equipment at work, such as a special type of keyboard and mouse for my computer and a bigger monitors so I can see better when I'm wriing on my computer. Access to Work paid some money so that my employer could buy the equipment I need.

7. HOW IT WORKS ON AN ONGOING BASIS:

Each week I get my Line Manager to sign a form to authorise payments from Access to Work. These go back to the Access to Work office in Glasgow, then they process the payments. Piece of cake!
